

what is creative commons?

Creative Commons (CC) is a non-profit organization that provides licenses for creators putting out work in the public domain. Creative Commons licenses are public licenses that various users can use to protect personal work from copyright infringement. CC licenses can be utilized in specific ways that indicate what and what cannot be done with their work by other creators looking to use it.

creative commons in education

Educators and teachers can use Creative Commons licenses to modify educational resources to deliver and reuse educational resources. Creative Commons licenses are essential in contributing to educators' enlargement of learning networks.

Attribution | CC BY



This license lets others distribute, remix, adapt, and build upon your work, even commercially, as long as they credit you for the original creation. This is the most accommodating of licenses offered. Recommended for maximum dissemination and use of licensed materials.

Attribution-ShareAlike | CC BY-SA



This license lets others remix, adapt, and build upon your work even for commercial purposes, as long as they credit you and license their new creations under the identical terms. This license is often compared to “copyleft” free and open source software licenses. All new works based on yours will carry the same license, so any derivatives will also allow commercial use. This is the license used by Wikipedia, and is recommended for materials that would benefit from incorporating content from Wikipedia and similarly licensed projects.

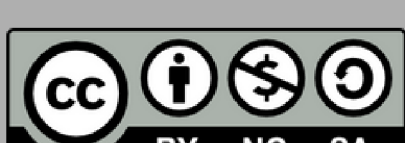
This license lets others reuse the work for any purpose, including commercially; however, it cannot be shared with others in adapted form, and credit must be provided to you.

Attribution-NonCommercial | CC BY-NC



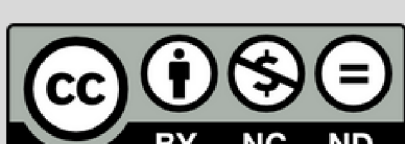
This license lets others remix, adapt, and build upon your work non-commercially, and although their new works must also acknowledge you and be non-commercial, they don't have to license their derivative works on the same terms.

Attribution-NonCommercial-ShareAlike | CC BY-NC-SA



This license lets others remix, adapt, and build upon your work non-commercially, as long as they credit you and license their new creations under the identical terms.

Attribution-NonCommercial-NoDerivs | CC BY-NC-ND



This license is the most restrictive of our six main licenses, only allowing others to download your works and share them with others as long as they credit you, but they can't change them in any way or use them commercially.

benefits

- CC contributes to global recognition of work in different digital content websites.
- CC licenses are relatively simple and easy to understand. The simplicity of a CC license makes it easier for content creators to protect their work and allow others to use it.
- CC licenses are flexible, with different licensing options to help creators choose how to protect their work and how it is distributed.
- CC licenses encourage the use of resources, which contributes to building a vast majority of knowledge networks and content creation.

considerations

Key considerations when it comes to utilizing Creative Commons licenses:

- Licenses cannot be revoked
- The material must be appropriate for licensing and specify what is being licensed
- A clear motive must be provided to using other material with CC licenses
- Specify any additional permissions, if required
